

The Penguin Project © was conceived by Dr. Andrew Morgan, a developmental pediatrician, to give children with special needs an opportunity to participate in the performing arts. He created The Penguin Project © recognizing that theater not only provides children with a valuable recreational experience and an opportunity to display their creative talents, but also enhances social interaction, communication skills, assertiveness, and self-esteem.



In 2017, we launched the Golden Isles Penguin Project with 21 Artists and 24 Mentors who performed to sold out audiences in Annie, Jr. Since then, our Penguins have wowed audiences with Peter Pan, Jr, Shrek the Musical, Jr, Bye Bye Birdie and High School Musical Jr.!

The Penguin Project demonstrates that individuals with special needs are fully capable of participating in community activities with the same dedication and enthusiasm as others, if given the opportunity and support.

What is The Penguin Project? The Penguin Project is a musical theater production that casts children and young adults with disabilities in all roles. Those individuals (Artists) will get assistance from on-stage peers (Mentors).

Participants

Young Artists with Disabilities

The Penguin Project is open to any individual age 10 and up with a disability. This includes (but is not limited to) Down Syndrome, cerebral palsy, autism, intellectual disabilities, learning disabilities, visual impairment, hearing impairment and neurological disorders.

Peer Mentors

The Penguin Project utilizes a “peer mentor” system linking each artist with an age level peer who does not have a disability. The peer mentors work side by side with their partners, assisting them throughout the entire rehearsal process on stage.
